My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On this Feast Day we acknowledge our Mother Church for all Catholics: Saint John of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. This Feast commemorating a Church Building is significant, but let us remember that **the people of God are the Church**. Saint Sylvester (Pope Sylvester I) honored the Cathedral as the seat of the Pope in 324. It continues to be a site of pilgrimage and religious significance, celebrated annually on November 9th. According to tradition, the Cathedral contains a small wooden table where Saint Peter celebrated Mass.
